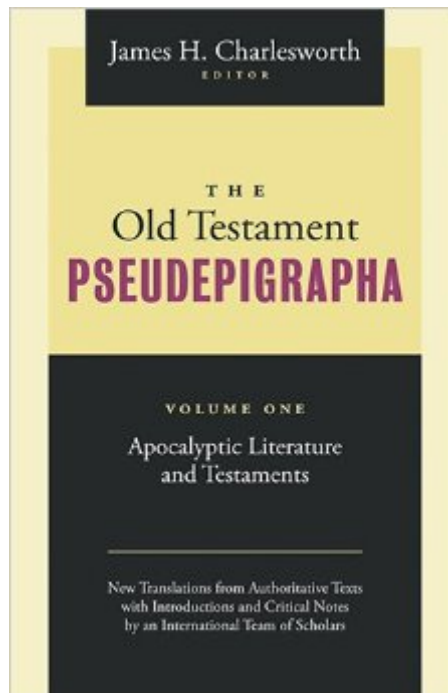

These books are to be desired over the R.H. Charles books. For some time now I had been wanting to obtain the Testaments of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob as well as a Complete Sybiline Oracles (usually not complete in other books - for example "The Other Bible"). I already had Vol 2. I would

suggest both Vol. 1 & 2 to anyone interested in the subject who wants an excellent and nearly exhaustive grouping of the said texts. The only thing left to obtain after you have these volumes are rare Ethiopian/Slavonic/Armenian/Syrian/Coptic/Rabbinical texts that in most cases haven't been published in English yet, or are only contained in incredibly hard to find and out of print scholarly journals/collections. Very highly recommended.

Ever wonder how the Biblical Canon was constructed? The Council of Nicea in A.D. 325, under the auspices of the final Roman Emperor/first Christian Pope, convened to -- among other issues -- decide which of the sacred texts extant to Christianity would become "Official." This book represents a good portion of what was "left out" of the Holy Bible, paints a broader picture of Mankind's early days, and -- most importantly -- would have been common knowledge to Spiritual leaders, up to and including Jesus Christ.
